WHAT IS PROTOCOL


Definitions:

- The formal etiquette and code of behavior, and procedure for state and diplomatic ceremonies.
- code of behavior, manners, courtesies, customs, formalities, etiquette, decorum, rules of conduct

Why Lions need Protocol:

- PROJECT AN IMAGE OF HIGHLY ORGANISED AND PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATION
- ☼ TO OVERCOME CONFUSION OF WHO COMES FIRST
- TO FOLLOW ORDER OF PRECEDENCE
- ☼ TO ADDRESS CORRECTLY IN SPEECH
- TO DRESS IN APPROPRIATE MANNER
- TO AVOID MAKING YOUR GUESTS FEEL OUT OF PLACE (eg SEATING)





When do we use protocol

- Official Lions events (projects or functions)
- The Invitations (emails, letter, etc.)
- Seating
- Addressing the guests present
- Souvenir Programme





Flags, Anthem & Toasts

- ♥ When host's flag is displayed, flag of principal guest's country should also be displayed
- ☼ National Anthem... host's first or guest's first?
- ☼ National Anthem Act 1968 (revised1989)
- Section 6(1): At all official receptions to foreign dignitaries where salute is given, the full or Royal version of the National Anthem shall be played **immediately after** the Anthem of the country of the visiting dignitary has been played.
- ☼ Toast to Malaysia Royalties (be sure glass contains non-alcoholic drinks / water): Please join me for a toast to Seri Paduka Baginda Yang-Di Pertuan Agong / DYMM Sultan of.. / TYT YDN
- □ Toast to LCI: Please join me as I toast to our beloved organization I give you the Association of Lions Clubs International



Order of Precedence

 Used to acknowledge or introduce Lions dignitaries





Used when arranging seating at a head table, or on a stage



Lions shall be recognized in the following order:

- 1.Head of State / Royal Family / T.Y.T.
- 2. Presiding Officer
- 3.International President
- 4.Immediate Past International President
- 5.International Vice President (according to rank)
- 6.Past International President (b)
- 7.International Directors (a) including appointee
- 8.LCIF Board of Trustees
- 9. Past International Directors (c)
- 10. Past LCIF Trustees and Past Board Appointees

- 11. GAT/LCIF Constitutional Area Leader, New Voices Constitutional Area Chairperson
- 12. LCIF Vice Constitutional Area Chairperson, GAT Regional Area Leader
- 13. LCIF Area Leaders, GAT Area Leaders, New Voices Constitutional Area Speaker
- 14. Chairperson, Council of Governors
- 15. District Governors (a)
- 16. International Administrative Officers (a)
- 17. Multiple District LCIF Coordinators
- 18. Immediate Past District Governor








Table Seating Arrangement on Stage (no podium)

Presiding Officer must always be seated at the most "Center Seat"

Guest of Honour occupies Seat No. 2 (to the right)

Head Table Seating


Presiding Officer must always be seated at the most "Central Seat"

Principal Speaker occupies Seat No. 2 (to the right)

Other Lions Dignitaries in accordance with General Order of Precedence




Round Table Seating Arrangement

Order of Precedence



When 2 names are identical

More Than 1 Present

Recognize according to Roman Alphabetic Order of 1st letter of family name

If 1st letter is the same, go to the 2nd letter, and so on.

The one with the longest association membership shall be given precedence

More than 1 is present

The one who served most recently is given precedence, and so on.



Head Table Introductions

- Begins with Presiding Officer
- From the lowest rank on Order of precedence to the person with the highest

Present:

- 1. District Governor
- 2. Guest of Honor
- 3. Presiding Officer
- 4. Past District Governor
- 5. Past District Governor's wife
- 6. Past Council Chairperson
- 7. Area GLT Leader
- 8. Past Club President
- 9. MDCC PDGs
- 10. Vice District Governors

Introduction:

- 1. Presiding Officer
- 2. Past Club President
- 3. Past District Governor & wife
- 4. Past Council Chairperson\
- 5. MDCC (PCCs/PDGs)
- 6. Vice District Governors
- 7. District Governor
- 8. Area GLT Leader
- 9. Guest of Honor



Some important pointers

- ✓ When Spouses are present, they should be seated to the member's left when on the left side of the table, on the member's right when on the right side of the table
- ✓ Emcee (OC) should be seated according to local customs or on one end of head table (LCI). In many occasion, basing on seat availability is practiced
- ✓ If there are more than one head table, table at the highest level should be considered the primary one
- ✓ Place Lions of the same rank on the same table
