9 Clubs from Region 2 & 3 have also completed a 3 days 2 nights Region 3 Rural Service Project for natives from 7 longhouses in the interior part of Sarawak. It was a great fellowship for all Lions who have participated.

Clubs are encouraged to carry out more overnight rural service projects during the next few months. District Foundation is willing to share part of the cost.

Lions Club of Kuching Elite from Region 1 has been reinstated by LCI after having zero membership for 3 months. The new Board of Directors have also been installed during the month.

Waiving of LCI new member entrance fees of USD35 will end by 31/12/2020. Clubs which have planned to add in new members in 2021 may consider to add in December 2020. Total dues saved will be USD13.50 per member.

District Subsidized Lions Training will be continued during the next few months. All qualified Lions are encouraged to apply to join Emerging Lions Leaders Institute which will be held in Sibu from 22/1/2021 to 24/1/2021. District Certified Trainers Program & Faculty Development Institute will be held in March next year.

Disaster Relief

Region 1 Lions Clubs delivered relief supplies to 35 fire victims at Kampung Bintawa Ulu. A fire broke out involving 7 houses on 14th November 2020. 5 houses were burnt down while 2 were affected.

Zone 1 - Lions Clubs of Kuching Allamanda, Kuching City, Kuching Emerald New Century, Kota Samarahan & Kuching North.

Zone 2 – Lions Clubs of Kuching Elite, Kuching Hornbill, Kuching Host, Kuching Kota Sentosa & Kuching Stampin-Pending.

Zone 3 – Lions Clubs of Kuching Ixora, Serian, Kuching Metro & Kuching Centennial.



**The following report below has been modified for newsletter purposes.*

Humanitarian Project Reported by President Richard Goh from Lions Club of Lutong

Project: Donation of food rations, kitchenware, household items, hardware, towels and used but clean clothing to fire victims @RH Panjang Balau Musnah Ulu Baram

Jointly organised by 10 Lions Clubs from Zone 10 and Zone 11 of Region 4, Miri.

The 10 Lions Clubs are: Batu Niah, Lambir Miri, Lutong, Miri Mandarin, Miri Centennial, Miri Host, Miri Central, Marudi Mandarin, New Century Miri Resort City and Miri Seahorse.



The other 2 NGOs namely Mari Makan and Under One Roof helped to deliver the donated essential items to RH Pajang Balau, which was about 9 hours from Miri by road.

The longhouse at Long Balau Musnah consisting of 25 doors was on fire at midnight on 4/11/2020.

A joint effort by 10 Lions Clubs (Zone 10 & 11) of Region 4 to help relieve predicaments of fire victims of RH Long Balau Musnah Ulu Baram. The Miri Lions Clubs successfully applied Emergency Grant from International Lions, together with the contributions from 10 Lions Clubs of Miri which totalled to about rm4200+. We bought dry foods, kitchenware, household items, face masks and hardware to donate to the fire victims. We witnessed the collection of food items, daily necessities, goodies and used clothing assembled at KX Garage this afternoon for loading onto delivery trucks prior to their departure to the Kampung on 14/11/2020.

PDG Mary Wee, Region 4 Chairperson Lina Hu, Zone 10 Chairperson Aini Kho, Zone 11 Chairperson Suzanne Lee, DCs, Club Presidents and members of various clubs showed up at the assembly point KX Garage. Food items were packed into bags for easy distribution to fire victims when they arrive at the longhouse, and the bags were loaded onto the trucks. Many brought along their own used clothing, cooking utensils, electrical appliances etc for the village fire victims.

It took about 8-9 hours drive from Miri to RH Long Balau Ulu Baram by road. The transport team started their journey early on 14th November 2020, stayed a night at Long Seridan (Homestay and self-paid), then during the next day on 15th November 2020 continued to drive to Long Balau village to hand over the essential household items, food rations and others to the fire victims.

When the handover was conducted at Long Balau, the Penan villagers were overjoyed to receive the kitchenware, household items and clothing. At the same time, some additional donated items like clothing, kitchenware, dining sets and food rations were also channelled to other nearby Penan villages which remain inaccessible by road.

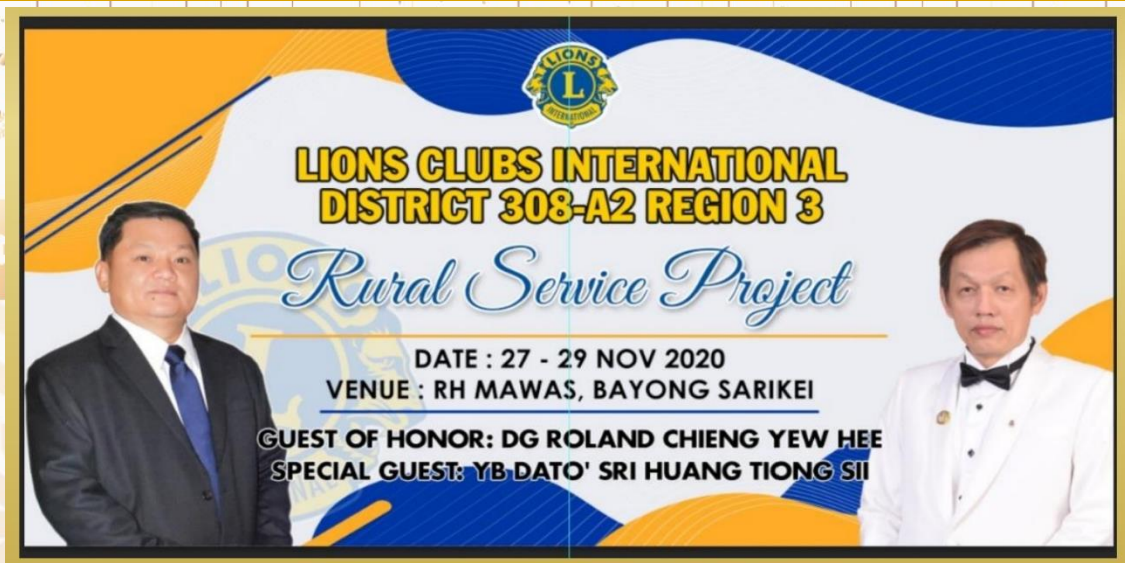

Reasons and justifications for this Rural Service Project:

During the 1st Zone 7 Lions Clubs Meeting, Region 3 Chairperson Alex Yii proposed to the eight Lions Clubs in Region 3 that they should jointly organise a 3 days 2 nights Rural Service Project for Ulu area communities as most of them come from low income family. They urged the Lions to assist them in one way or another such as providing them with health awareness, environment cleaning, donation of groceries and food, children exercise books & stationeries and etc. His proposal was agreed by Zone 7 four Lions Clubs and since this Rural Project was suggested to be organised at Ulu Sarikei, the Lions Club of Sarikei was appointed at the meeting to be responsible for organising activities in the said rural area. It was necessary for the team to run a survey at the Ulu area to find out which longhouse residents are relatively poor and urgently in need of our Lions Club to assist. Past President David Kua and I went to Rumah Nyuka Longhouses in Ulu Sarikei to investigate, and we found that the said longhouse were in need of our support, so we decided to carry out our activities for 3 days and 2 nights in this longhouse.

Summary of Activity:

On 30th October, we called the 1st Organizing Committee Meeting in Sarikei and we discussed a series of service activities which will be organised in Rumah Nyuka for 3 days and 2 nights, including Hunger, Environmental, Vision, Diabetes, Care for Children, Health Talk, Donation of face masks, hand sanitisers, groceries & food, children exercise Books & Stationeries etc.

Unfortunately, in mid-November, the Covid-19 pandemic cases have suddenly increased, so the Tuai Rumah of Rumah Nyuka did not allow our Lions Club's activities to be held in their longhouse. Therefore we had no choice but to find other longhouses for our Rural Project. With the help of YB Dato' Sri Huang Tiong Sii, he suggested us to organise these service activities at the longhouses which urgently needed our help namely Rumah Mawas, Rumah Empaling, Rumah Soon and Rumah Mering.

On 27th November around 2:00pm, Lions from Region 3 drove all the way from Sibul to Sarikei, we gathered together and did the final preparation such as packing foods, cakes, drinks, stationeries etc for Rural Activities. During evening time at 6:30pm, we all gathered and had a fellowship dinner at the Fortune Restaurant while District Governor Roland Chieng gave us a motivational speech, and our 3 days 2 nights Region 3 Rural Service Project also official Launched by District Governor, Roland Chieng.



On 28th November early morning around 8:00am, we drove all the way from Sarikei to Ulu Rumah Mawas. Tuai Rumah Ak Timbu and Longhouses people gave us a warm welcome. Lions from Sibul Pahlawan had set up tables for Blood Sugar/ Cholesterol and Blood Pressure Checking, while Sibul Nangka and Sibul Bawang Assan Lions had set up the place for Eye Checking. Last but not least, Bintangor Lions arranged places for children to do their Coloring Contest and etc. During the event, District Governor Roland Chieng, YB Dato' Sri Huang Tiong Sii, Tuai Rumah Ak Timbu and myself as the Organizing Chairperson individually delivered our speeches before all the Service activities were carried out. Breakfast was also prepared for VVIPs and Lions before the starting of service events.



Due to unwell of President of Sibu Rejang Dr Jane Lau, member of Sibu Pahlawan Grunsin Ak Meting had represented on behalf of her to deliver a thorough yet essential Health Talk to the rural people. Later, Sibu Pahlawan President Dixon Chiu, GMT Coordinator Dato' Jimmy Tie, PDG Dato' Betty Wong and their members started to help the rural people to complete Blood Sugar & Cholesterol Testing as well as Blood Pressure Checking. Sibu Nangka President Kapitan Ivy Sim, DC Joan Ngu, DC Bill Leong and Sibu Bawang Assan IPP Godfrey Ting and members were the people in charge of Eye Checking and distribution of Spectacles to Rural people. Besides, Guest of Honour District Governor Roland Chieng, Special Guest Dato Sri Hong Tiong Sii, 2nd VDG Kapitan Connie Loh, PDG Dato' Betty Wong, 9 Clubs Presidents & Representatives had also handed over First Aid Kits, Groceries and Foods, Face Masks and hand sanitisers to the four Tuai Rumah.



We worked until noon time and we started to serve the Rural people with Lunch. Right after lunch, Bintangor President Ling Mee Ngik and members handed over Exercise Books & Stationeries to the Rural Children and distributed colouring papers for the children to begin the colouring contest. After the Children had completed the Coloring Contest, IPP Godfrey Ting of Sibu Bawang Assan judged the Children artworks, prizes and Gifts were presented to the 3 Categories Winners and to all the participating Children. Zone Chairperson Wong Eng Siong of Sibu Queensway was in charge of the cleaning campaign and she led everyone to pick up the trash surrounding the longhouses. After we completed all the service activities on 28th Nov, we drove back to Sarikei and stayed at Sarikei Hotel as the longhouse did not provide any spaces for us to stay.



Our Club Past President, District Chairperson Kapitan Ling Dien Yong hosted delicious Seafood Dinners for all the participating Lions from outstation at his Eurasia Cafe n Lounge.



On 29th November early morning around 8:30am, we visited our Club IPP Ngu Tung King's Coffee Factory before we drove to the nearby Longhouses waterfall. We enjoyed clean waterfall and had some fun there. We were served with Barbaque Lunch at Waterfall with Rural People as well as Lions. "Save the Planet" Signboard was officially launched by District Governor Roland Chieng. We did the cleaning campaign and picked up trash all the way from Waterfall to the entrance. We finished around 11:30am, then we drove to Jakar for Fellowship Lunch before Region 3 Lions drove all the way back to Sibü.

Thank our Region Chairperson Alex Yii to initiate the mission of organising a Regional Rural Service Project under his Region 3. Sincere thanks to LC of Sibü Pahlawan for the blood pressure, glucose and cholesterol checks; LC of Sibü Nangka and Sibü Bawang Assan for the Eye Check and Spectacles give away; LC of Bintangor for the Youth projects - Coloring contest and Stationary Donations; LC of Sibü Mandarin for Donation of Mask, sanitizers and groceries; LC Rejang for Health Talk; and LC of Sibü Queensway for the Environmental & Cleaning Projects and lastly LC of Sarikei for the food and necessities for the project. 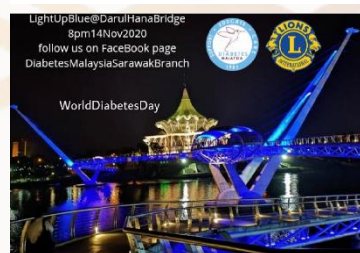

Leo Lions Club of Kuching Elite held a virtual challenge on Facebook in conjunction with Diabetes Awareness Month.



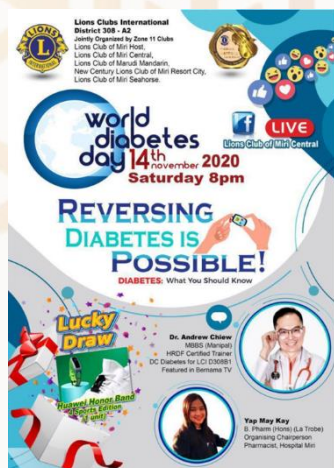

Reasons and justifications for this Childhood Cancer Project:

1. Infusomat: Currently in Sibu Hospital, there are about 20 children with newly diagnosed cancer annually. Every day, an average of one or two children have need for blood transfusion. Currently, the children cancer ward does not have a dedicated Blood Transfusion Pump – it has to be borrowed from the other children ward. Hence, this donation is much needed so that children with cancer do not need to wait for their turn to transfuse, and also reduce the risk of infection having to share with other children with infectious diseases.
2. Vital sign monitor: Currently the children cancer ward has only one monitor. At any one time, there are 2-3 children in the ward needing monitoring. Having an extra monitor would improve the care of these children in the ward with closer monitoring.

Summary of Activity:

We met Dr Toh Teck Hock (Sibu Central Hospital Pediatrics Specialist) at the Tribal Meet@Sibu & Follow Up SOP organised by Sarawak Convention Bureau on 10th Sept at RH Hotel. After the Seminar, Dr Toh brought to our attention that the Hospital is lacking 2 Medical Equipments, which are Vital Signs Monitor and Infusomat Blood Transfusion Pump and he requested for the Lions Clubs' assistance.

President Dixon Chiu and I mobilized the other two Lions Clubs: Lions Club of Sibu Sungai Merah and Lions Club of Sibu Bawang Assan to jointly apply for the District 308-A2 Foundation Matching Grant. As the 2 Equipments cost RM11150, we applied for RM6000 from the District Foundation's one to one Matching Grant.

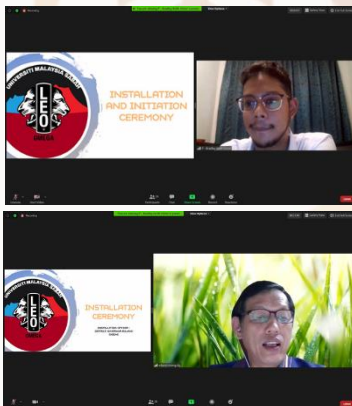

KOTA KINABALU: A humanitarian movement started by a group of university and high school students seeks to feed 1,000 poverty-stricken households affected by Covid-19 restrictions in Sabah.

The movement, called the Dua Ringgit Project, is the brainchild of multiple Leo Clubs from Universiti Malaysia Sabah, community-based organisation Keningau Centennial and eight secondary schools.

Supported by Lions Club International, the project aims to reach out to more underprivileged people after coming off the back of a successful first phase of food distribution where it managed to feed 250 families.

But with most of the funds in the first round collected among supporters, friends and family members – only RM7,000 has been collected since Oct 21 – the project is now banking on the generosity of the public.

“The first phase started last Oct 15 when we managed to collect RM10,000 in just five days,” UMS Leo Club president Bradley Keith Victor told FMT.

“With that money, the Lions Club bought the food items and distributed them to 250 families

in Kota Kinabalu, Keningau and Tawau.

“Among those we have helped were stateless people and the homeless. One of them resides in a dilapidated house in Keningau and walks 5km every day to ask families living near the town for spare change so he can have a meal.”

Victor, who is the donation drive coordinator, said they hope to collect RM40,000 to feed 1,000 families.

The next phase will be expanded to include underprivileged households in Tambunan and Tenom districts as well as some parts in east coast Sandakan.

Victor said the name Dua Ringgit Project was based on research which showed that underprivileged families typically spend an average of less than RM7 a day for all the three daily meals combined.

“That means it’s about RM2 for each meal (breakfast, lunch and dinner). That’s where the Dua Ringgit Project came from.”

He said they hope to provide RM50 worth of food packages comprising essential items to each family.

“If we sacrifice small luxuries like a Sunday ice cream cone

just for a day or two, we can already feed a family for a month,” he said.

Victor said the Leo club members were moved on seeing the plight of poor families who lived in harsh conditions, which were made worse by the pandemic.

“We actually planned to go around giving them mee bungkus or nasi lemak but since we can’t go back to university (due to the CMCO), we decided instead to host an online donation drive and later sought help from the Lions Club,” he said.

Victor, a final-year international relations student, now works part time in Seremban while attending online classes at night.

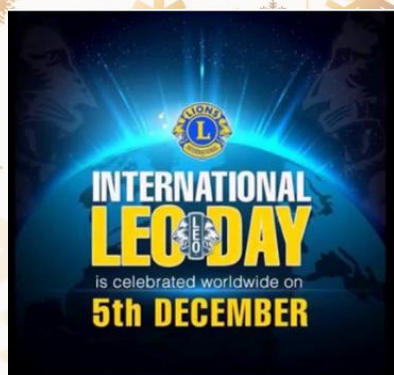
He said they also planned to put aside RM10,000 to buy milk powder for babies. “Some of the families don’t have the means to purchase milk and many of the children we saw were malnourished. They asked if this can be one of the items in our package,” he said.

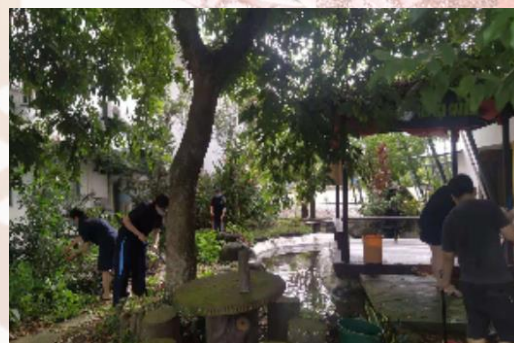

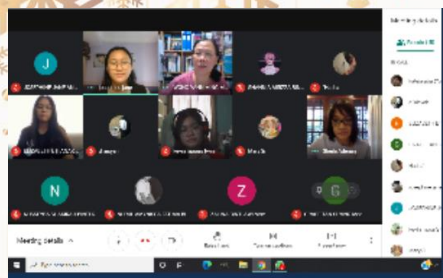

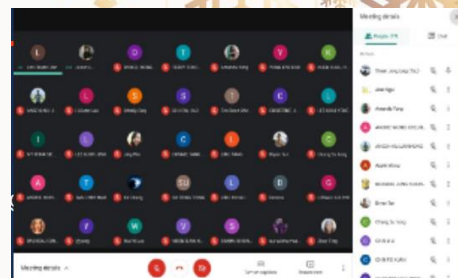
