
I am glad that we were able to show our District's news and activities this fiscal year and we will continue doing so. Despite the regions in District 308-A2 going

As we are drawing closer to the end of term, I would like to introduce the Newsletter team and to show my appreciation towards everyone who was involved in the production of the District newsletters.



Form One student wins merit award in international poster contest

STUDENT Wu Gin How is a merit award winner in the 33rd Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest.

District 308B1 governor Kenny Low said Gin How's entry was selected as one of 23 merit award winners based on creativity, originality and portrayal of the theme "Peace Through Service".

As such, Gin How will receive US\$500 (RM2,025) and a certificate of merit.

The merit award winners were from Brazil, Bulgaria, China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Italy, Malaysia, Taiwan, the Philippines and the United States (California, Connecticut, Florida, Kansas and Minnesota).

Approximately 600,000 children

from 50 countries participated in this year's contest, where 110 were selected to be judged at the international level.

The artwork of the Form One student from Foon Yew High School in Johor Baru was submitted for the international competition after it won the national Peace Poster Contest in November last year.

His entry came out tops out of 115 submitted from 68 Lions clubs.
The peace poster contest gave children a chance to express their vision of peace and inspire the world through art and creativity.
The grand-prize winner will be announced at the Lions Day with the United Nations.

Region 1 Lions Activities

Lions Club of Kuching Allamanda

A health seminar was organised by Lions Club of Kuching Allamanda in collaboration with a specialist from Singapore. Topic: Are Cancers in Childhood Similar to those in Adults -Symptoms and Signs? Attended by Lions members and the public.



Lions' webinar on paediatric cancer attracts 80 participants

MIRI: 'Are cancers in children similar to those in adults' webinar on Saturday (March 27) attracted 80 participants from

attracted 80 participants from different parts of the state. Organised by Lions Club of Kuching Allamanda in collaboration with CanHope Kuching sponsored by Parkway Cancer Centre, the webinar saw paediatric haematologist and oncologist Dr Anselm Lee sharing insights on paediatric cancer. Dr Lee pointed out that common paediatric cancers are Hodgkins Lymphoma, Acute

Hodgkin's Lymphoma, Acute lymphoblastic leukaemia, lymphoblastic leukaemia, Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, kidney tumours, brain tumour, neuroblastoma, bone tumour, muscle/ connective tissue tumours and acute myeloid

tumours and acute myeloid leukaemia.

"Cancers in children are generally rare diseases. However, in terms offrequency, leukaemia is the most common type of cancer in children. In adults, the common types of cancer are lung cancer, breast cancer, colon cancer which almost never happens to children."

Dr Lee explained, adding that development of cancer for children and adults differ too.

"Lung cancer caused by

smoking takes more than 20 years to develop. If a child was exposed to digarettes from birth, he or she wouldn't develop lung cancer during childhood. Therefore, all the risk factors for cancers in adults may be irrelevant to children cancer.

Hereditary factors on the

irrelevant to children cancer.

Hereditary factors, on the other hand, accounts for less than two per cent of cancers in children. From the scientific perspective, we still do not know why the great majority of cancers happen in children. Symptoms of paediatric cancer can be variable too.

Tever, aches in the knee, feeling of exhaustion, spending more time in bed, tripping and falling are some common signs and symptoms of childhood cancer.

and symptoms of childhood cancer.

"Even so, these are also common signs and symptoms for other childhood illnesses, or can happen from time to time to healthy children during bad day. Therefore, there is no exact explanation or fixed pattern for recognition," he added.

Meanwhile, the options for cancer treatment are similar for both paediatric and adults with fundamental differences in terms of outcomes.



"If a cancer treatment could keep an adult aged 50 or 60 years old for another 10 years,

years old for another 10 years. the treatment is considered highly successful.

"But if a treatment can keep a 50 ro 10 years, it is not a good treatment. A successful treatment must be able to give the child a chance to good future of growing up. completing education, finding a career and build a family, 'said Dr Lee who is proud of five former patients who have grown up to become medical doctors. The one-hour webinar was also attended by district governor of Lions Club International District 308-A2. Roland Chieng.

Chieng in his welcoming speech said that according to

World Health Organisation, about 400,000 new cancer cases are diagnosed each year among children aged zero to 19 years

adult cancers and over 60 per cent of all children can now be completely cured with proper, intense treatments. Therefore, the webinar was a good opportunity to give insight to the local community as

well as increase awareness on paediatric cancer," he added. He thanked Lions Club of Kuching Allamanda, CanHope Kuching and Parkway Cancer Centre, Singapore for the collaboration.



Reasons Why Members Leave

Retaining/Losing members is an issue for many clubs. Below are few areas that are most influential on why someone may leave a club: -

- 1. Too many disagreements, personality clashes, drama, cliques, too many politics, and not feeling respected by other members of the club.
- 2. Feeling like they are "Not making a difference". If clubs don't match members up with activities that they want to do, or if they feel as though their voice isn't heard, then even if the service is

- 3. Not having a "Sense of Belonging". If members do not feel like they belong, then they will not stay a member for very long. Everyone wants to feel valued. When people join clubs or an organization, they do so to be part of something and to contribute towards something. When they feel that their participation or efforts are not acknowledged, they begin to feel as though the organization they want to be part of doesn't appreciate them. As a result, they feel that leaving the club would be a better option.
- 4. Club no longer offers the satisfaction it once did, and its ability to adjust to the expectations of younger members.



- 5. Club is dominated and controlled by few members.
- No meaningful service activities. Members feel their contribution and involvement are not worth the effort.
- 7. Club does not have enough project funds and administration funds to support their community services and activities.

Are you ready to take action?

Many clubs don't recognize their growth and retention problems if the number of members remains somewhat steady. Clubs that consistently lose members and compensate by inducting new members are not managing their growth or retention well. If your club is not focusing on growth and retention you may be headed for trouble. Getting new members and keeping current members is a sign of a club's stability and overall wellbeing. Make your membership growth and retention your club's top priority.
